SUMMARY

The ongoing humanitarian crisis in northwest Syria (NWS) remains difficult for the 2.8 million displaced populations with attacks on civilians and humanitarian workers, a struggling economy, and COVID-19. To meet the needs of populations, IOM transshipped 150 trucks of assistance during the second quarter of 2022. IOM began offering health clinic appointments in two IDP camps, offering more than 4,000 appointments in Q2. IOM also continued to supply humanitarian partners with assistance, which reached more than 375,000 people. To prepare for the summer months, 1880 families received tent insulation to help maintain cooler temperatures. Additionally, five camps received infrastructure support including roads and drainage systems, and teams continued to provide emergency WASH services and CCCM support across planned and informal camps in NWS. IOM also continued to refer beneficiaries in need assessed by our Mobile Assessment Teams, and our NFI team distributed NFI kits to 1,100 families. Almost 20,000 people who struggle to meet their nutritional needs received monthly food support, and IOM gave more than 500 people business development training to improve their livelihood opportunities. IOM Protection teams also provided risk education, housing land and property, and civil status documentation sessions. IOM also provided training on humanitarian access, protection, and site management support. So far in 2022, IOM has reached more than 834,000 beneficiaries.

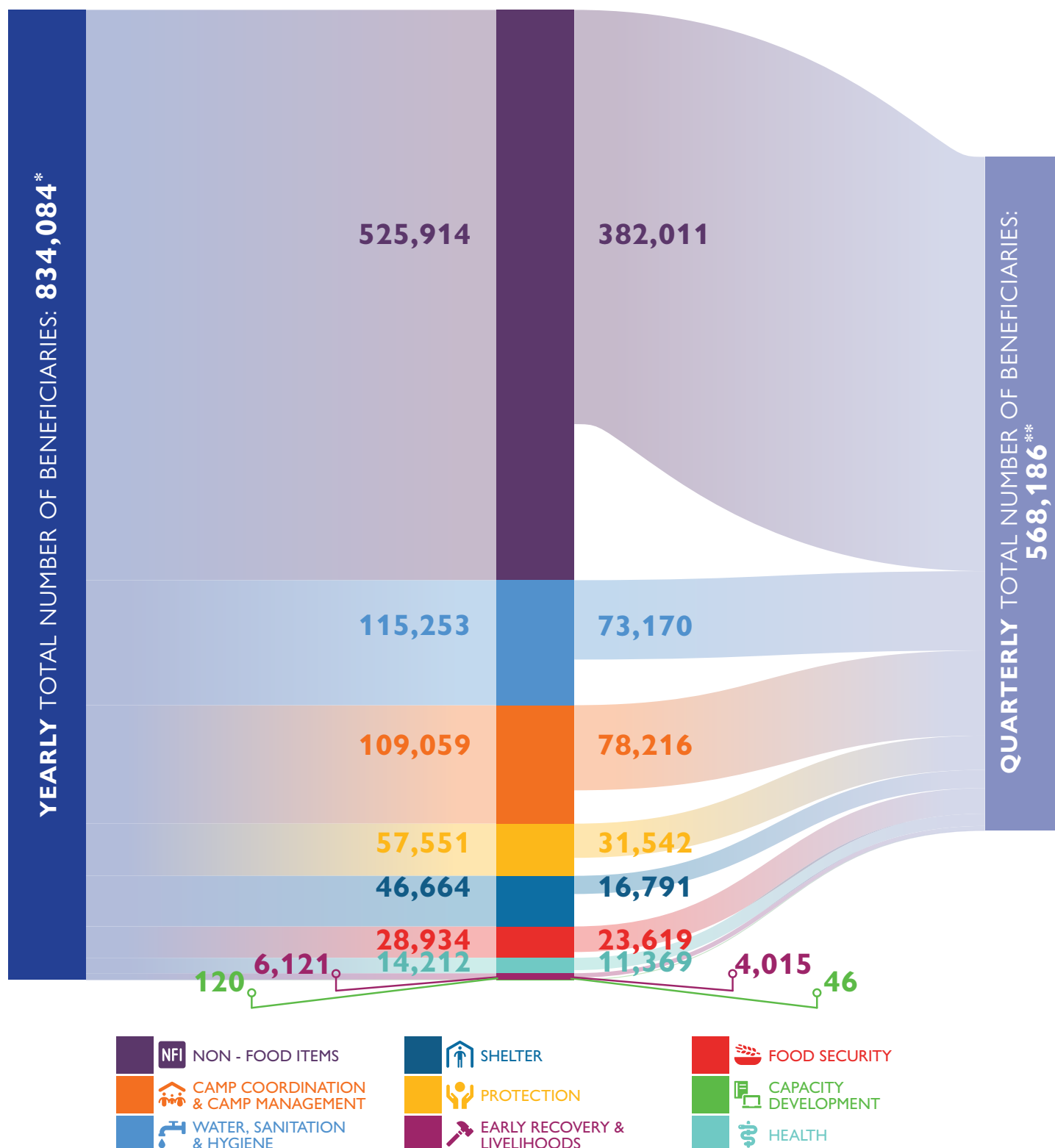
QUICK OVERVIEW AND BREAKDOWN OF INDIVIDUALS SUPPORTED DURING Q2 & YEAR 2022

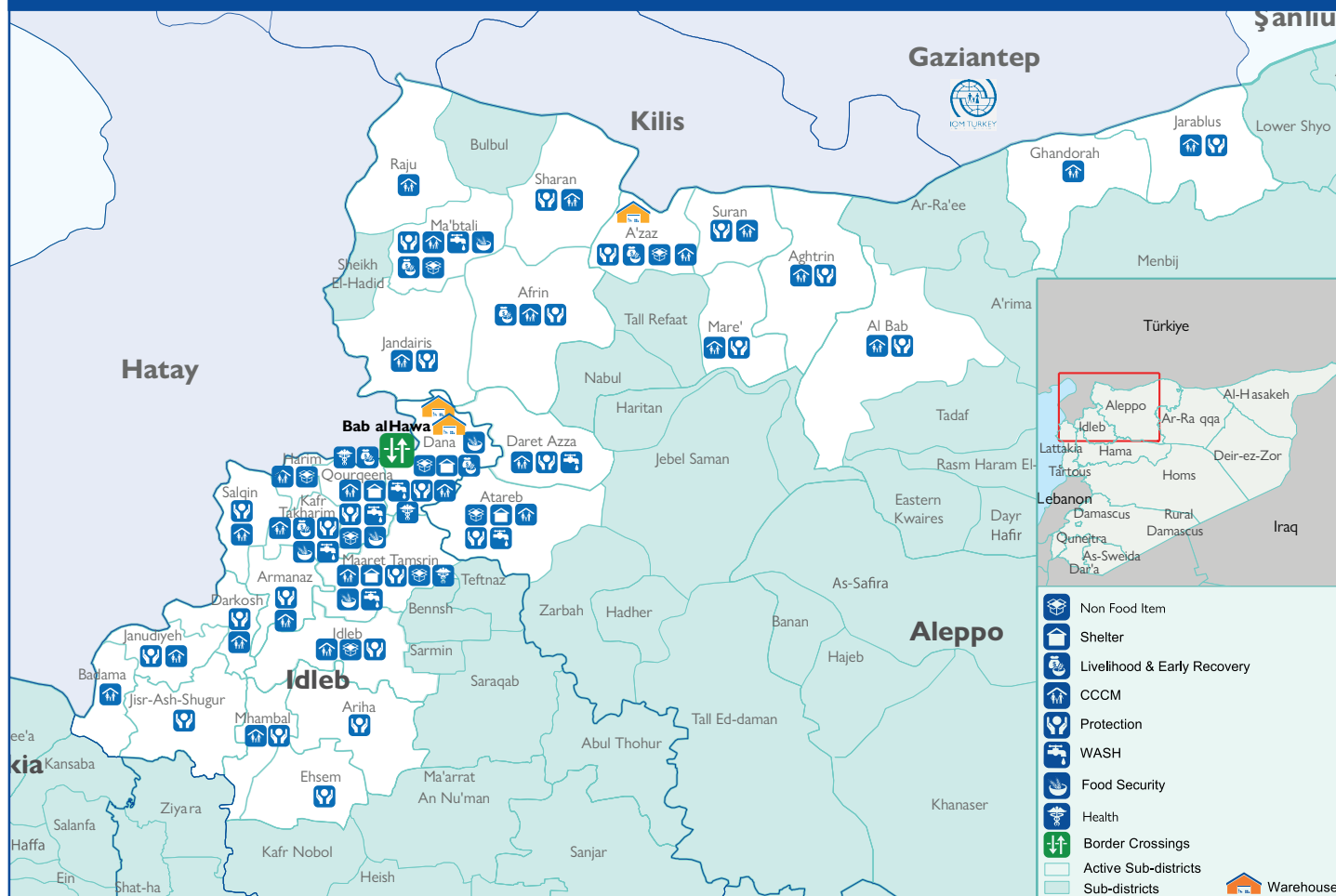

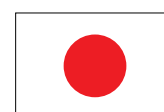
